Site Visit Surveys 2014-2015

(n = 37)

- MD responsible for TM?
 - 75% pathologists, 61% GP, 12% AP, 3% HP
 - 3% hematologist, 12% TM specialist
- Education for TM Medical Director?
 - 19% BE Lite, 14% BE 10-module
 - 51% 'other', 24% N/A



Site Visit Surveys 2014-2015

(n = 37)

- Education for prescribing MDs?
 - 35% BE3 handbook
 - 35% BE Coag handbook
 - 16% BE Lite
 - 16% BE 10-module
 - 46% 'other', 11% N/A



Site Visit Surveys 2014-2015

(n = 37)

- Do you have blood product guidelines?
 - 55% yes, 40% no
 - IVIg 38%, RBC 27%, PLT 24%, FP 19%
 - 30% 'other', 5% 'all'
- Do techs screen orders? – 60% Y, 33% N
 - 35% IVIg, 24% RBC, 16% FP, 14% PLT
 - 46% 'other', 3% 'all'
